Having trouble enrolling in a class? Please check the Schedule of Classes and click on the course ID Number link to check enrollment restrictions. Some departments restrict enrollment to their majors on 1st pass (such as many courses in Sociology, History, Political Science), but should open up to other majors on 2nd pass. If courses are already full at that point, you can always approach the instructor to see if s/he will give you a PTE#, or keep checking enrollment (especially through the 1st week of classes), to see if any spots open up.

Courses that are **multiple listed** appear with an 'M' in front of the course number. Multiple listed courses often have different enrollment restrictions, but enrolling in either course will count towards the same requirement. For example, the course description for History M184B indicates that it is the same course as Jewish Studies M184B and is listed separately on the Schedule of Classes under each of these departments and course numbers. If there are enrollment restrictions under one listing of the course, or one is already full, try enrolling in the other (check restrictions first!). Regardless of how you enroll, the DPR will apply either course towards the particular requirement it fulfills.
