

AFRICAN STUDIES MINOR

The African Studies minor allows students to augment their major with a concentrated study of Africa and its issues. It is primarily designed for students who plan to live and work in Africa or who are interested in government and public services careers involving African affairs.

Admission to the Minor:

To be admitted to the African Studies minor, students must be in good academic standing (minimum 2.00 UC GPA overall), and have completed all preparation for the minor courses with a minimum GPA of 2.00 in these courses.

After satisfying the preparation requirements, students may declare the African Studies minor upon consultation with the African Studies Academic Counselor.

Please note the following restrictions:

- ❖ All courses for the minor (including preparation for the minor courses) must be taken for a letter grade.
- ❖ The minimum GPA for preparation courses for the minor is 2.00. The minimum GPA for upper division courses for the minor is 2.00.
- ❖ No more than two Upper Division courses may be applied toward both this minor and the student's major or another minor.
