CSW Advisory Committee member Dr. Kimberly Narain wanted a resource for her 7-year-old daughter that connected America's past to the social unrest of the present, but couldn't find what she was looking for. The only logical solution? To create a children's book on structural racism. *The Cycle of a Dream: A Kid's Introduction to Structural Racism in America* aims to provide children with a template to understand how discrimination functions on multiple levels to create advantages for some and disadvantages for others. Dr. Narain hopes that this book will enable them to recognize the ways that they are privileged and empower them to fight to create a more socially just world.

- Labor migration can greatly impact health of migrants' left-behind families.
- The study examines the connection between men's migration and their wives' mortality.
- Wives of non-migrants and of migrants as a whole have similar mortality risks.
- Wives of successful migrants are less likely to die than wives of unsuccessful ones.
- This mortality differential is present in risks of HIV/AIDS-unrelated deaths only.
